Course Description: Introduces basic human communication principles and theories embedded in a variety of contexts including interpersonal, small group, and public speaking.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. Apply principles of human communication including:

perception, verbal/nonverbal communication, listening and audience analysis.

2. Demonstrate how to establish/maintain relationships through interpersonal communication.

3. Apply small group communication skills including:

problem-solving, group roles, leadership styles, and cohesiveness.

- 4. Develop, research, organize, and deliver formal public speeches.
- 5. Recognize how to communicate within diverse environments.

Course Requirements:

- 1. You will be tested on class lecture/discussion materials on scheduled exams.
- 2. To take thorough notes, study all lecture material, informational handouts, and assigned readings, and work/prepare in a language understood by instructor and class (English).
- 3. To actively participate in class discussions and group activities.
- 4. To show maturity/professionalism in preparation of assignments and in classroom behavior. (*Disruptive/inappropriate behavior may result in being dropped from class.*)
- 5. To show courteousness to fellow classmates.
- 6. To communicate with instructor when assistance is needed regarding class assignments.
