SYLLABUS MUSI 0000.001 RECITAL ATTENDANCE/PERFORMANCE SPRING 2020

Instructor: Dr. Hye-Gyung Ji

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Office and Class Location: Fin Arts Building Rm. 116 Office Hours: Posted on the office door or by appointment.

Location of Events: Wisian Recital Hall (FA Rm. 118) or Jones Theatre

This course may satisfy a core curriculum requirement. It is a **PASS** or **FAIL** course designed for students either to prepare for performances or to transfer recital attendance credits to transferring universities.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Expose students to various concerts to learn different musical genres / professional performances etiquettes and support classmates' performances and departmental events.
- 2. Let the students learn rehearsal procedures and offer them a performance opportunity to share their musicality through the student recitals. For those music majors who are not enrolled in this quadruple zero course will not be eligible to perform at the student recital.
- 3. Experience event management through participating in performance services.

RECITAL ATTENDANCE POLICY

To pass this course, students should meet three requirements below.

- 1. Mandatory Attendance: a music majors meeting, all student recitals, sophomore recitals, and any department/faculty showcase concerts.
- 2. Additionally, students are required to attend 75% of other events such as a guest artist recital, jazz band concert, symphonic band concert, concert choir, or ensemble concert.
- 3. Participation in at least one of performance services per semester is required.

If an absence is necessary, the student should give Dr. Ji a notice <u>in advance</u>. Verbal notice after concerts will NOT be accepted. You should directly submit your recital attendance slips to an usher of each event. All students are required to dress professionally when performing or doing the performance services.

PERFORMANCE SERVICES

Every semester, all students are in charge of accomplishing at least one of performance services. The student assistants should arrive no later than 30 min. before the announced event start time and be aware of the duty. The performance service sign-up clip board is located at Dr. Ji's office door.

- 1. **Stage Manager** supervised by Dr. Deborah Gelber (Rm. 117)
- 2. Usher supervised by Dr. Hye-Gyung Ji (Rm. 116)
- 3. **Recording Assistant** supervised by Dr. Darin Cash (Rm. 142)
- 4. **Reception Assistant** supervised by Dr. Hye-Gyung Ji and Fine Arts Secretary (Rm. 132)

Detail guidelines for each performance service duty will be handed out in a separate sheet.

RECITAL PERFORMANCE PROCEDURES

Music majors receive one performance opportunity per semester for the Student Recital which keeps about a limited number (10) of performers at every recital. If you plan to perform on a specific date, you should submit a student recital application form in advance upon the decision of performance date with your studio professor and accompanist.

To submit your student recital application form, please follow below steps.

- Open Blackboard and find your MUSI0000 Course
- Click on the Student Recital Info TAB
- Click on the Blue attachment: <u>Student Recital application form .docx</u> to download (or just download it from this announcement)
- Fill out the form and save it with your last name in the title. (example: Gelberrecitalform)
- Back in Blackboard, In the Student Recital Info TAB, click on the Bold words: Student Recital Application
- In the **Attach Files section**, click on browse my computer and find your saved form.
- Click Submit.

Your pianist will be announced on a board at the beginning of each semester. IT IS STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE AN INITIAL CONTACT WITH THE PIANIST AND RECEIVE / UNDERSTAND ACCOMPANIMENT POLICIES.

As soon as your repertoire is chosen for the semester in agreement with your studio professor, please make a copy of your music and submit it to your pianist as soon as possible. To have a reasonable amount of time to prepare the music, the pianist must have your music <u>in advance</u> of rehearsal and performance (Reference to your pianist's accompaniment policy).

Your performance preparation should be proved by your studio professor's signature on the student recital application form. **Deadline of the recital form submission is MONDAY AFTERNOON of the recital week on Blackboard.** If your recital request is submitted later than its deadline, it won't be acceptable until the next recital. **To cancel your performance, you must notify Dr. Gelber no later than WEDNESDAY MORNING** of the recital week.

FACILITY MANAGEMENT POLICIES

No food and drink allowed in the recital hall and the foyer at the front of the Fine Arts building that is carpeted. The piano in the recital hall is used by only faculty at any time, but students may use the instrument for dress rehearsals prior to a performance under the control of professors. After using the piano, it should be always **locked and covered.**
