- 5. Use graphs, tables, and technology to analyze, interpret, and compare data sets.
- 6. Construct and use mathematical models in verbal, algebraic, graphical, and tabular form to solve problems from a variety of contexts and to make predictions and decisions.

Course Evaluation: EdReady will evaluate the mastery of each student and give a score between 0 and 100. This course will be graded on a pass/fail basis. Once the student has completed the course with at least 90% mastery, the student will have earned a grade of P, indicating "passing" for the course. If the student does not achieve a 90% level of mastery, the student will have earned a grade of F and will be required to complete the course again.
