#### **General Course Information:**

#### **Course Level: Introductory**

**Course Description:** Introduction to the theory and practice of hair cutting. Topics include terminology, implements, sectioning and finishing techniques.

**End-Of-Course Outcomes:** Identify terminology and practice basic workplace competencies related to haircutting and finishing technique. Demonstrate use of implements, sectioning, haircutting, and finishing skills.

**Course Competencies:** Upon successful completion of this course, the student will:

- Possess an understanding of the terminology of haircutting and finishing techniques.

- Demonstrate the proper utilization of implements used in haircutting.
- Perform correctly a zero degree, 45 degree, 90 degree and 180 degree elevation haircut using the scissor and razor.
- Perform a military haircut (fade) using the clippers, correctly.
- Execute a minimum of twenty-four haircuts (three of each described degree and clippers).

### **Academic Integrity:**

**Course Outline:**

CSME 1310 students will demonstrate competencies in the following tasks;

- Understanding of the terminology related to haircutting and finishing techniques.
- Utilization of scissors, razor and/or clippers.
- Complete written assignments related to theory and knowledge of haircutting and finishing techniques.
- Knowledge and performance of zero degree, 90 degree, 180 degree and a clipper haircut.
- Safety precautions related to the use and care of all implements related to hair cutting.
